J.L. Wallace Finishes Construction of Eco-Friendly Bunche Beach Preserve

FORT MYERS, Fla. (June 28, 2010) – J.L. Wallace Inc. has completed construction of Bunche Beach Preserve, a new Lee County park along San Carlos Bay. Bunche Beach Preserve, located on John Morris Road in Fort Myers, is self-sustaining, meaning no conventional electric or water utilities are needed to maintain it.

The project, which is just over one acre in size and near Bunche Beach, included site work, storm water retention system, parking area, restroom facilities, fishing piers, kayak launches and boardwalks.

Several “eco-friendly” building strategies were implemented throughout the project. The boardwalks and piers are constructed using recycled wood and plastic. Electricity is being generated from solar power. All of the restrooms use reclaimed rainwater, and all rain run-offs from the parking area are captured and managed through a subsurface storm water management system.

David Grossman, a Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED®) Accredited Professional, served as the project manager, DeWayne Banks was the superintendent, and Robbyn Spears was the project manager assistant.
